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Issues of Relevance to HPC

The composition of the Board was reviewed. As the shape of the HEA changes as a result of government policy then the board needs to ensure it is as widely representative as possible. It was noted that there was disproportionate representation of medical practitioners and students compared to those of nursing and HPs. Representation by students representing these latter disciplines is to be pursued.

The 2010 National Student Survey data is being analysed to look at trends amongst health students nationally.

While the Browne review mentioned the HEA positively in relation to its role in enhancing the quality of learning and teaching in HE, its future remains uncertain. It was felt likely that there would be further cuts to the HEA beyond the 30% already announced. Nonetheless the HEALTH Advisory Board felt its composition put it in a unique position and felt it had much to offer in its ability to 'scan the horizon' and act in an advisory capacity as it spanned medical, HP, nursing, dentistry, pharmacy and veterinary education.

The HPC update led to discussion on the perceived importance by members of the board for the need to confirm/collaborate around practices within the FtP of students amongst the various regulators.

It was also seen as appropriate to strengthen the links between practice educator networks in a range of professional groups in order to develop national guidelines, standards and frameworks.

• To review the remit of the Board in the light of the new HEA structures to be announced on November 10th.
