### SUMMARY

This paper provides an update from the UK and International Registration Departments for the period November 2006 and December 2006.

### 1) OPERATIONAL PERFORMANCE

### a) Telephone Calls

- i) UK Department During the period from the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2006 to 31<sup>st</sup> e team received a total of 9745 telephone calls and 95% of calls were answered, which is a 17% improvement on the same period last year. The team have continued to improve the 'time to answer' all calls, with the average 'time to answer' improving from 145 seconds in December 2005 to 27 seconds in December 2006.
- i) International Department During the period from the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2006 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2006 the team received a total of 2637 telephone calls and 93% of calls were answered which is a 11.5% improvement on the same period last year. The team have continued to improve the 'time to answer' all calls, with the average 'time to answer' improving from 28 seconds in December 2005 to 8 seconds in December 2006.

### b) Application Processing

i) UK Department – A total of 694 new applications were received during this period and 794 individuals were registered. Applications took on average 4.5 working days to process

from start to finish compared to 10.5 days for the same period last year.

Applications for readmission were taking an average of 2 working days to process.

ii) International Department – A total of 403 new International and Grandparenting applications were received in this period and 575 individuals were registered. The team have continued to focus on improving service delivery and have now reduced the days to initial assessment decision from International application to 34 days in December 2006 compared to 73 days in June 2006.

### c) Emails

- i) UK Department The team are receiving approximately 40/50 emails per day and are managing to respond to these within a couple of hours in most cases.
- **ii)** International Department The team are receiving approximately 30/40 emails per day and are responding to these within 48 hours of receipt.

### d) Registration Renewal

The last of our 13 professions has finished renewing registration for the second time and 905 ODP's lapsed from the Register on the 1st December. This equates to 10.4% of the total number of registrants originally invited to renew registration. When compared with other professions this was mid-way between Paramedics (13.7%), the highest number of

registrants lapsed this cycle and Radiographers (7.2%), the lowest number lapsed.

Renewal applications were taking an average of 48 hours to process.

### 1) EMPLOYEE RESOURCE

Both teams are currently operating within their budgeted headcount with operational effectiveness improving.

We recruited 1 Registration Officer (Daryl Francis) during the period who was previously employed as a Senior Operator in a contact centre environment with Language Line

### **Project Management – Claire Phillips**

Since the last Finance and Resources committee meeting the majority of Claire's time has been absorbed by the projects' prioritisation and selection process for financial year 2007/8.

The timetable for this work has been as follows:

### October 2006

- Each department asked to identify all potential major projects for consideration for inclusion in 2007/8
- All projects prioritised according to the agreed prioritisation criteria

### November 2006

- Core group of staff from the EMT and Middle Management groups engaged to determine a list of projects to be further investigated to estimate predicted costs
- The criteria used in this process were:
- Project priority
- Business benefit
- Estimated resource requirements (human and monetary)
  - High-level business requirements gathered
  - Estimated project costs and budgets prepared
  - Proposed projects included in first version of the budget

### December 2006

- Core group re-assembled to limit the proposed list of projects
- The criteria used in this meeting were the same as the previous meeting; however greater emphasis was placed on the assumed resource requirements.
- Since the projects being proposed to be undertaken are both complex and resource-intensive a clear business decision was taken to be pragmatic as to the number of projects that can be realistically delivered. This decision was taken to further improve the project management process and to raise the standard of the end product.

A list of projects has been included in the budget to be presented by Simon Leicester.

In addition to the above, Claire has collected business requirements and liased with our Technology suppliers with regards to completing the following LISA changes:

- Fees change
- Online Authentication
- Intermediate lapsing

Finally, due to the departure of Cathy Savage Claire has assumed the Project Manager responsibilities for CPD. She has been liasing closely with the Policy and Registrations departments (who are taking the lead in this project) in order to finalise the operational processes.

The 2006/07 academic year schedule is now closed. Between September 2006 and July 2007, there are 85 visits, covering 129 programmes. All

scheduled visits have had their executive members assigned and we have recruited visitors for all visits until mid June 2007.

The Department's peak months are Feb – June, with an average of 12 visits per month. The month of March 2007 is at capacity due to a four multi-professional events.

We have had 9 visits cancelled by education providers to date. 4 have been rescheduled into dates later in the year (so effectively postponed), 1 has been rescheduled into the 2007/08 academic year and it is our understanding that the remaining 4 will be asking for a dates in 2007/08.

Appendix 1 shows the detail of the visits from March – July 2007. Appendix 2 shows the breakdown of visits, by profession, month and reason Appendix 3 shows the long-term trends of visits.

### Annual Monitoring

In December, the Department contacted all education providers to inform them of their requirements for the 2006/07 round of annual monitoring. This included the distribution of the revised supplementary information and appropriate forms.

In January, the Department began planning the assessment days and general workload of the process. The Department are expecting to receive 82 declaration forms and 109 audit forms this year, with peak submissions dates between Jan – May 2007. It is likely that we will hold four assessment days (Feb, April, May and June).

### **Minor and Major Changes**

The Department has received 10 minor/major change submissions between 1 November 2006 and 31 January 2007. 6 have been signed off by Panel, whilst 4 are still outstanding <u>Publications</u>

The Department is currently working on publishing the final copies of the approvals process and annual monitoring process supplementary information. It is hopeful that these will be available in late November 2006.

The Department has recently begun work on updating the education section of the main HPC website. We hope to alter the layout of our pages and increase the accessibility of publications and forms, so that education providers have a greater pool of resources available to them about the approvals and monitoring processes. We also plan to work with the Communications Department to change the format of the Register of approved courses, so that potential applicants can search the approved programme list and link directly to education provider websites.

#### Visitors

The Department is currently working on the arrangements for Visitor training sessions for new and current visitors. We are hoping to hold sessions for new visitors in December 2006 and separate sessions for refresher training in

January 2007. Once these have been held, we will decide whether additional training will be necessary before the reappointments process in July 2007.

The Department will be contributing to the Partner Conference in late November 2006. A breakout session will give Visitors an update on the work of the department over the last eighteen months as well as a presentation on the new 'annual monitoring' and 'major minor change' processes.

### Employees

Katherine Lock, the new Team Administrator started on 11 September 2006. Two new Education Officers, Daljit Mahoon and Chris Hipkins, started on 18 September 2006 and 30 October 2006 respectively. A third Education Officer will hopefully be appointed in early December 2006.
