Executive summary and recommendations

Introduction

At the 31 May 2007 meeting of Council it was agreed that the Fitness to Practise Committees should meet as a joint forum at their April and September meetings and that following the completion of the forum each committee would hold a separate committee meeting at which any recommendations from the forum would be considered and, if thought appropriate, ratified.
